Discussion Questions on Biblical Authority

1. What is your view of the Bible's authority? How does it (or does it) intersect with and inform our lives, from family to work to entertainment and everything in between?
2. If the Bible is indeed authoritative, what are the implications for your life?

Discussion Questions on Critical Thinking

1. Do you think most people know how to think well? Why or why not?
2. How does our culture harm our ability to think critically?
3. What's the difference between objective and subjective truth?
4. Do you think there are objective truths about religion? If so, how can we discover those truths?
5. Does if you believe something make it true for you?

Discussion Questions on Culture

1. How do Christians generally talk about and view culture? In what ways do those views shape how we react to and live within our own culture?
2. Are you more tempted to withdraw from culture or capitulate to it? In what ways?
3. Which ideas are most influential in American culture today? Who are the champions of these ideas? How does our culture communicate them?
4. How should a Christian worldview shape the way we think about and engage with culture?
5. What examples can you think of in which Christians have positively impacted culture, even during a very dark time?
